- **Ottoman rule in the Balkans: from decline to modernisation theory and from centralisation to negotiation, 9/12/2016**

Antonis Hadjikyriacou was recently elected as Assistant Professor of Early Modern Ottoman and Mediterranean History at Boğaziçi University. He earned his Ph.D. in History from SOAS, University of London, and he is completing his monograph entitled *Insularity and Empire: Ottoman Cyprus in the Early Modern Mediterranean*. His new project is a comparative spatial history of Cyprus and Crete, mapping the development of economic structures in the two islands in the early modern period, using Geographic Information Systems (G.I.S) and Digital Humanities tools. For the past two years he was Marie Curie Fellow at the Institute for Mediterranean Studies, Foundation for Research and Technology-Hellas. He has previously worked and taught at Princeton University, SOAS, the University of Crete, and the University of Cyprus.
